Our Five-Year Curriculum

Developing students' English and Literacy skills is fundamental to **unlocking their potential** across the academic curriculum and beyond. We strive to empower learners to be confident global citizens with a **passion for the written word**, an ability to communicate expertly and think creatively, and inspire students with a **love of all reading**. Pupils will be encouraged to develop a love of reading through studying classical and modern literature across the five years. They will study Shakespeare, pre-1914 literature & poetry and modern plays and novels to acquire an understanding of how writers use character, theme and language to engage readers.

Pupils will also learn how to use the techniques they study in their own writing, learning how to use a range of devices for different purposes and audiences. Pupils will also be taught how to use spoken language to convey their thoughts and ideas and communicate well in a range of situations.
